Dear Cattle Producers;

Welcome to the 20<sup>th</sup> annual Mississippi Beef Agribition. The Board of Directors would like to express our sincere appreciation to the consignors for providing a quality set of Show calves, Registered Bulls and Commercial heifers (pairs, breds and open). We also want to thank you the buyers for attending and we feel confident you will find the quality of this year's offering to be as good or better than other sales in the region.

It is no secret we are in a lower market compared to the last two years, however, calf prices can still keep the herd profitable, if marketing is a top priority and the genetics in your herd can produce high growth efficient cattle. Cow/calf producers must apply good management decisions which includes marketing, not selling, good herd health and continue introducing the top genetics into the herd. With that said, producers are also aware that production cost may have leveled off for this year, as fertilizer prices appear to be slightly lower and feed prices are holding steady at this point. With a cautious eye on the markets, this may be the right time fill the pasture with highly productive females that will give birth unassisted, re-breed in a timely manner and produce a 600 to 650 pound calf at 205 days. Why? Because these young females offered in this sale will be going into peak production just about the time the markets head upward.

As you study the sale offering note we have several opportunities to help you improve your herd beginning with a large selection of open heifers that will be ready to go with the bull. We also have some fall bred heifers for the producers that are on a fall calving program. If you are looking for heifers that will calve later in the spring, we also have a nice selection of those as well and we have several head that will be heavy bred and many will even have calves by their side. In addition to the heifers, we will have a good selection of young bulls to choose from. 9 Angus, 1 Balancer, 1 Brangus, 1 Gelbvieh, 3 Hereford, 1 Limousin and 2 Ultrablack. For the kids with show calf projects, don't miss the two outstanding Shorthorn heifers out of proven show winners and 2 English cross commercial heifers that will be competitive in their class.

As in years past, we will have Dusty Taylor with Taylor Made Auctions from Rustin, LA. as the auctioneer. Dusty is a good friend to Mississippi Cattlemen and he will be on hand Friday evening to evaluate the sale offering and help determine the sale order. Also as in years past, buyers will sign up to receive their bidders number. If you are a new bidder at the Agribition, please bring a letter of credit from your bank, which will speed up the sign up process.

The sale leads off at 12:30 Saturday, March 25 beginning with the show calf prospects, followed by the registered bulls and ending the day with the popular commercial heifer sale. Please remember that once, the sale begins, there will be no cattle loaded out until the sale is over. This prevents mistakes and assures the cattle you bought are the only ones that get loaded on your trailer. Generally, from the start of the sale until the end, it will take about 2 ½ hours to complete the sale and begin loading out after settlement is made at the sign in table.

The Bulls must pass a complete breeding Soundness exam before they are allowed in the sale. In addition each bull is screened at the sale by a committee for structural soundness or any other defects and a current weight is taken the day before the sale for buyer's information and to insure they meet minimum growth requirements for their age. In the heifer sale, open heifers are guaranteed open by the seller, bred heifers or cows have been checked no more than 30 days prior to the sale for pregnancy by the seller's veterinarian. Any first calf heifer or cow found to be pregnant by the seller's Veterinarian will be sold as bred. The Veterinarian will determine how many days or months bred these females are and indicate it by each animals tag number on the health papers that accompany these animals from the farm to the sale site. Any up-dated information from the time the catalog was printed will be announced in the sale block before the female sells. Any females confirmed pregnant by the sellers veterinarian will sell as guaranteed bred (as indicated by the veterinarian) and to remain bred for 30 days after the sale. Any heifers or cows sold as bred and found to be open by a licensed veterinarian 30 days or less after the sale will be subject to a full refund to the buyer by the seller. 30 days after the sale date all guarantees expire.

We are looking forward to this 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Mississippi Beef Agribition and we know you will be pleased when you evaluate this sale offering. # TERMS, CONDITIONS AND GENERAL SALE INFORMATION

**TERMS:** Terms of the sale are cash. Settlements are to be made with the clerk immediately after the conclusion of the auction. The MS Beef Agribition acts as an agent only. The contract is between the buyer and the seller.

**BIDDING & DISPUTES:** All cattle will be sold at public auction to the highest bidder. The auctioneer will settle any disputes concerning bids, and the auctioneer decisions will be final.

**HEALTH:** By order of the State Veterinarian's Office, Mississippi producers are no longer required to have animal's blood tested for brucellosis. Health papers are **required** for all animals consigned to this sale. The health papers must indicate the pregnancy status of all females consigned to this sale. It is the responsibility of the buyer to know the health restrictions of his/her state and to be aware of the possibility of any subsequent testing of any animals purchased through this sale as required by law.

**REGISTRATION:** All bulls must be registered with their prospective breed associations. Properly signed certificate of registry transfers will be furnished to the buyer.

**BREEDING GUARANTEE:** Animals are guaranteed to be without defects, but nothing more. All sale bulls will have documentation of a passed breeding soundness exam, including scrotal measurements within 30 days prior to sale. Scrotal circumference measurement minimums for sale bulls are 32 cm for 12-16 month old bulls, 34 cm for 17-23 month old bulls, and 36 cm for 24+ month old bulls. Animals failing to breed, after a trial of six

months, may be returned to the seller, if in good condition. The seller reserves the right to try said animal for six months and, if it proves to be a breeder, to return it to the buyer at the Buyer's expense. If the animal proves to be a non-breeder, satisfactory exchange will be made or purchase price refunded.

**ANNOUNCEMENTS:** Announcements made from the auction block on sale day shall take precedence over information printed in the catalog. It is, therefore, the buyer's responsibility to pay attention to any such announcements.

**ANIMAL REMOVAL:** Bulls and/or heifers purchased at the Mississippi Beef Agribition must be loaded out by 9:00 P.M., March 25, 2017

**LIABILITY:** All persons who attend this sale do so at their own risk. The owners or sponsors assume no responsibility, legal or otherwise, for any accidents that may occur.

### Expected Progeny Differences (EPD)

Expected progeny differences (EPD) are a useful genetic selection tool. Expected progeny differences provide predictions of the expected performance of the calves sired by a bull compared to the expected performance sired by another bull. They are calculated as part of national cattle evaluation programs and are based on the performance records of an individual animal, its relatives, and its progeny. Many breed associations publish on individual animals in sire summaries and researchable Internet databases. Breed associations also publish tables that show where individual animals rank within the breed for specific traits such as weaning weight area.

Expected progeny differences can be used to make herd genetic improvement in both commercial and seed operations. They should be used in conjunction with other selection criteria in a balanced approach to select sires with acceptable combinations of economically relevant traits that will complement cow herds and market targets. Genetic improvement can mean increased weaning weights and growth performance, enhanced reproductive performance and better performance on the rail, all of which can enhance the profitability of an operation.

### Accuracy Values (ACC)

Expected progeny differences come with **accuracy values (ACC)** that give an indication of the reliability of the accuracy values help breeders determine the level of uncertainty or risk associated with selection decision reported as a decimal number between zero and one. Larger values indicate greater accuracy. Remember, they are directly compared regardless of accuracy. The amount of records available on various bulls is accounted for in the calculations. Accuracies simply reflect risk.

Accuracy may be categorized into low, medium and high reliability as follows: Low (0.00 to 0.50); Medium (0.51 to 0.75); High (0.76 to 1.00). Expected change tables are published by breed associations as part of national cattle evaluations to show how much variation can be expected for EPDs at specific accuracy levels. As usable performance information becomes available for an animal and its relative and progeny, the more accurate and reliable its EPDs become. Thus, a young, unproven bull with no calves will have lower accuracy EPDs than a sire with hundreds of calf records. Expected progeny differences should be used to decide which bulls are suitable while accuracy values suggest how extensively the bulls should be used. Bulls with favorable EPD values and corresponding high accuracy values can be used with confidence that they will make a favorable contribution to the improvement of the herd.

Heifer development is a function of Nutrition, herd health and genetics. All work hand in hand to help a producer reach the desired goals of reaching maturity by 14 to 15 months of age, breed early, calve unassisted, rebreed in a timely manner and remain in the herd for many years. The major obstacle with first calf heifers is getting them re-bred. Usually there is a nutritional deficiency that prevents them from breeding back timely. 30 to 45 days prior to calving, the nutrition level must be increased to give heifers additional energy to calve, begin nursing, finish growing and prepare to re-breed. Some heifers are underfed to prevent calving difficulty, however in truth, underfeeding only adds to the problem. Genetics has far more to do with calving difficulty than overfeeding.
